- 1 **School Presentations.** Fred Tapley is a huge asset to the PPS team, presented on the college and career center. College component, ISAC rep comes in to help students with FAFSA. 95% of seniors used Naviance. Dedicated a wall to students who are going to college, military, or trade. Used hashtag I decided. Featured 15 career speakers during the year. Field trip to Noise Floor Studios (sound engineering). Flyers created by students and him. 928 students participated in career day, 42 presenters, 80 staff volunteered. There were sessions and a Q&A. Notable speakers attended from various companies. 97% of students said the career day helped them start thinking about their careers. Students were able to try on the gear for firefighters, FBI, EMT, and Biologists. DS-balloons include trades, yes.
